# A Message from the Spackenkill Superintendent

Dear Spackenkill Community,

The Return to School Committee met yesterday to discuss our plans going forward. We're going to return in Hybrid 1 on January 19 as planned. The Return to School Committee will meet in a week or two to discuss when it would be appropriate to move to Hybrid 2, with the hope of a beginning date sometime in February. The long Presidents Day weekend includes two holidays (Friday, February 12, and Monday, February 15), and the committee discussed utilizing Wednesdays as a way to offer students more in-person time. After the Presidents Day holiday, we will have a string of five consecutive five-day weeks, which could logistically fit a move to Hybrid 2. More details are forthcoming.

In a meeting Wednesday with the Dutchess County Behavioral and Community Health Department (DBCH) and County Executive Marc Molinaro, we learned that over the next few weeks, we'll see a substantial increase in the allotment of vaccine doses available. Mr. Molinaro asks the public to remain patient. At the meeting, COVID testing of students and staff was discussed, but despite growing numbers in the positivity rate, we are unsure if we will need to test. However, the district has a plan in place if testing is needed.

### **Google Meet Issue**

As you probably already know, Google Meet continued to present problems this week. Our Director of Technology, along with local BOCES and other schools that are experiencing issues with Google Meet, met with Google, which is now investigating the issue. Hopefully, the problem will be resolved soon.

#### **COVID-19 Update and Dashboard**

Since we started the school year, we have had 33 positive COVID-19 cases. It's important that, even if they are remote, if a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, they should email their principal so that we know what's going on in the community and can continue to make informed decisions.
