Students of Mr. Shanks, Mrs. Morehead, and Mrs. McGuire recreated scenes and worked as an ensemble to bring the words of Shakespeare's *Macbeth* to life. Seventh graders have been immersed in "The Scottish Play" in their English classes and the teaching artists from HVSF were able to build upon their knowledge and experience by asking students to consider how gesture, power words, and sound effects work to make a written scene become a fully realized performance. Though we missed having the HVSF teaching artists and all of our students together in one classroom, we proved that virtual classrooms can (at least for now) substitute for physical togetherness.
