A Message from the Spackenkill Superintendent

Dear Spackenkill Community,

It's been a very snowy week, but spring is coming soon and we have much to look forward to. The big news is that Hybrid 2 will begin at Todd Middle School and Spackenkill High School this Monday, February 22 (see schedules below). We will begin in-person days of alternating elementary cohorts on Wednesday, February 24. Building principals have sent details to families.

The other big news is an update on the in-person K plan: We are gearing up to have our kindergarten back in school *five days a week* beginning March 1st, following current social distancing guidelines. We are excited to be able to move forward with this plan to bring normalcy back to the district. Nassau will be surveying grade 2 families and will incorporate that information along with the survey results from grade 1 in order to plan for more in-person time for those grades. We are awaiting guidance from the Dutchess County Department of Behavioral and Community Health (DBCH) before we are able to move forward with any plan for other grade levels.

On Friday, February 12th, the CDC released a framework of metrics to guide our processes. The DBCH is analyzing this framework and will soon provide Dutchess County districts with guidance on these metrics. This guidance will ultimately help to determine appropriate social distancing in our schools as we move to bring in more students.


