



# 2019 Spackenkill School District Tax Warrant and Tax Rates

- 2019 Tax Warrant was \$30,299,099 as estimated at budget adoption
- 2019 Tax Warrant Increase was 2.51%

#### **ASSESSMENTS**

- Each town assessor determines the valuation of real property including exempt real property and whether such property is subject to taxation
- Tax Grievance day is 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday of May
- Actual final assessments received mid-August

### **EQUALIZATION RATES**

- Percentage of full value at which the taxable real property for an individual municipality is assessed
- All equalization rates are at 100%
- Used to create uniform assessments among municipalities
- Set by the Board of Real Property Services in August

#### TAX LEVY

Represents the total amount of taxes to be collected

The tax levy is the only factor that the Board of Education controls

#### 2020 – 2021 Tax Cap Calculation

#### **Key Factors**

- □ The Average Annual Change in the CPI for 2019 was less than 2% making the Allowable Levy Growth Factor for the 2020-2021 Tax Levy Limit 1.81%
- No exclusions for TRS or ERS
- Tax levy increase cannot exceed 3.7% (rounding) based
   on exclusions for district capital expenses
   and growth factor
- Tax levy proposed will not exceed 2.99%

# Budget with PD Enhancements only

Professional develop initiatives includes AVID (MS), Balanced Literacy (K-6), Math curriculum alignment (MS), Dr. Riter, classroom strategies for challenging learners (K-12) & Science alignment (MS & HS). (funding from Federal & State grants).

## Staffing Additions

Restore District Administrative position (Assistant Superintendent and internal hire) and hire one new principal (add 1 FTE of an administrator).

Add a Tech 1 or clerical support position for the IT Department to comply with the new Ed Law 2 D per the IT Audit.
